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<b>Professional perspectives</b>	Graduates can work locally, nationally, and internationally within sports clubs or federations, tourism organisations, museums or cultural associations, companies active in entertainment and event organisation.								
<b>Educational perspectives</b>	Possibility of continuing studies at SUPSI with a Master of Science in Business Administration or at other Swiss or foreign universities. In addition, it is possible to attend continuing education courses (CAS, DAS, MAS) at SUPSI or at other SUP or universities, in order to specialize in the many areas of the Leisure field.								
<b>Admission requirements</b>	This Bachelor program accepts a limited number of applicants; therefore, a ranking examination is required. A Vocational Baccalaureate with a specialization in economics and services (MPES), a Cantonal Baccalaureate with a specialization in commerce or a High School Diploma in Hotel Management and Tourism (SSSAT) is required. High School Diploma's and foreign Baccalaureates/ High School Diploma's in business or unrelated courses require a period of professional practice. <b>How to register</b>	The application for admission must be submitted exclusively online on the SUPSI Student Portal.
